Dial-A-Ride Program


We offer an in town Dial-A-Ride service for grocery shopping or medical needs.



EVEN "HEALTHY" PEOPLE NEED HEALTH SCREENINGS

Did you ever put off doing a task or getting a test and later wished you'd just gotten it over with? If you have Medicare, now's the time to talk with your doctor about whether you should get screened for prostate cancer, colorectal cancer, breast cancer or other types of cancer. Screening tests can find cancer early, when treatment works best.

Don't put off screenings if you're worried about the cost—Medicare covers a digital rectal exam once every 12 months. Also, Medicare covers a variety of colorectal cancer screenings—like the fecal occult blood test, flexible sigmoidoscopy, or colonoscopy—and you pay nothing for most tests. Medicare also covers Mammograms, Pap Smears and pelvic exams every 12 months.

Did you know that prostate cancer is the most common cancer in men, second only to lung cancer in the number of cancer deaths? You're at a higher risk for getting prostate cancer if you're a man 50 or older, are African-American, or have a father, brother, or son who has had prostate cancer.

Colorectal cancer is also common—in fact, it's the second leading cause of cancer-related deaths in the United States among cancers that affect both men and women. If everyone 50 to 75 got screened regularly, we could avoid as many as 60% of deaths from this cancer.

In most cases, colorectal cancer develops from precancerous polyps (abnormal growths) in the colon or rectum. Fortunately, screening tests can find these polyps, so you can get them removed before they turn into cancer. If you're 50 or older, or have a personal or family history of colorectal issues, make sure you get screened regularly for colorectal cancer.

New Medicare cards are on the way

Changes are coming to your Medicare card. By April 2019, your card will be replaced with one that no longer shows your Social Security number. Instead, your card will have a new Medicare Beneficiary Identifier (MBI) that will be used for billing and for checking your eligibility and claim status. And it will all happen automatically – you won't have to pay anyone or give anyone information, no matter what someone might tell you.

Having your Social Security number removed from your Medicare card helps fight medical identity theft and protect your medical and financial information. But even with these changes, scammers will still look for ways to take what doesn't belong to them. Here are some ways to avoid Medicare scams:

- Is someone calling, claiming to be from Medicare, and asking for your Social Security number or bank information? Hang up. That's a scam. First, Medicare won't call you. Second, Medicare will never ask for your Social Security number or bank information.
- Is someone asking you to pay for your new card? That's a scam. Your new Medicare card is
 free.
- Is someone threatening to cancel your benefits if you don't give up information or money? Also a scam. New Medicare cards will be mailed out to you automatically. There won't be any changes to your benefits.
