- 2. The designer of the 50-Star Flag Lived in Lancaster Ohio. Robert G Heft who was 16 at the time was one of thousands to design a flag. His design became the Official flag in 1960.
- 3. Americans will Enjoy 150 Million Hot Dogs During the 4th holiday.
- 4. Only Two Men Signed the Declaration of Independence on July 4. Charles Thompson and John Hancock. The other signed over the course of the month.
- 5. There Is Something Written on the Back of the Declaration of Independence. According to the History Channel. a simple message is written upside-down across of the signed document that reads. "Original Declaration of Independence dated 4th July 1776
- 6. One Signed Later Recanted the Declaration of Independence. Richard Stockton, a Lawyer from New Jersey. became the only signer to recant his support.
